

'LURLINE BAY' STREETS AND HISTORY OF NAMES

BANKS STREET	Possibly named after Sir Joseph Banks (1743-1820), a botanist with Captain Cook. Formerly called Victoria Road
BOOMERANG STREET	So named because of its shape. Boomerang is the Aboriginal word for a throwing weapon.
BUNYA PARADE	Aboriginal Word meaning "shade"
CLOSE STREET	Named after Richard Colonna-Close who owned some land in the area in the 1880s-1890s. The land was later subdivided under the name of Colona Point Estate in 1910.
CUZCO STREET	Name of a sailing ship trading between South America and Sydney. Cuzco also the name of the Inca capital in Peru.
DENNING STREET	George Denning, a Randwick Council alderman c. 1860-1880s and mayor of Randwick 1885. Known as Government Rd until 1897.
DUNCAN LANE/STREET	Formerly known as Nelson Road, and Gordon Street
EDGECLIFFE AVENUE	Possibly because of its promiximity to the cliff edge
INMAN STREET	<i>ORIGIN OF NAME UNKNOWN.</i>
JACK VANNY MEMORIAL PARK	Named after John Francis Vanny, alderman for the Central Ward 1971 - 1983. Deputy Mayor 1980-1. First dedicated 1959.
LIGURIA STREET	Name of a ship in the Orient Line.
LURLINE BAY	Formerly known as Lilli Pilli Bay. It appears to have been named after a tug in a similar manner as was Undine Street. Another theory is that the bay is named after an opera by the famous Irish composer, William Vincent Wallace (1812-1865)
LURLINE STREET	Probably named after the bay on which it ends.
MALABAR ROAD	Originally named Long Bay Road and part of Mount Street.
MARINE PARADE	Formerly known as Hector Road and the Esplanade. Changed in 1925 following a suggestion from the Maroubra Bay Progress Association.
MERMAID AVENUE	Changed from Lilli Pilli Bay Road in 1942. Presumed to have been renamed after one of Sydney Harbour's tugs, named, "Mermaid".
PALMER STREET	<i>ORIGIN OF NAME UNKNOWN.</i>
RON FILBEE PLACE	Named after a prominent local citizen, a member of Maroubra Surf Club, who was killed in a car crash in 1958. The street was named in 1959.
SACKVILLE STREET	<i>ORIGIN OF NAME UNKNOWN.</i>
SEASIDE PARADE	So named because of its proximity to the ocean.
THE CAUSEWAY	Causway, means a raised roadway. This road runs along the edge of a steep slope.
THE CORSO	Italian name for a road or pathway usually leading to the water.
TORRINGTON ROAD	Possibly named after the small town in Lincolnshire, England
UNDINE STREET	Named after one of the Sydney Harbour's tug boats. Undine was the <i>mermaid</i> who fell in love with a mortal.
WATERSIDE AVENUE	Beside the water
WILSON STREET	Presumably named after R. E. Wilson, a Randwick Council alderman 1920-1940's. Formerly called Wentworth Road.
